




	Singular	Plural	
-s	cat horse	cats horses	Singular means 'one.' Plural means 'two or more.' To make most nouns plural, add-s.
-es	watch dish bus box	watches dishes buses boxes	Noun ending: -ch, -sh, -s, -x Plural form: Add -es.
-ies	baby pony	bables ponies	Noun ending: a consonant + ·y Plural form: Change y to I and add -es.
rregular	child man foot	children men feet	No rules More examples: sheep - sheep tooth - teeth woman - women
