## VI. 混合題

The outbreak of coronavirus has severely affected industries around the globe. Due to the travel restrictions, the tourism industry all over the world has been massively affected. According to the World Travel and Tourism Council (WTTC), if the pandemic continues for several more months, over 75 million people are going to lose their jobs. Every tourism-related business has been struggling not to go bankrupt. As of April 2, 2020, British Airways was reportedly ready to lay off 36,000 employees. These potential job losses are bringing real and profound anxiety to millions of families around the world.

The travel industry in the US is among the hardest hit. With the US Travel Association projecting a loss of 4.6 million jobs through May, Americans are suffering an early winter now. The shutdown of tourism is the key element behind this horrible job-loss count. In a city like Las Vegas, which relies heavily on tourists to make profits, hotels and casinos are closed due to the loss of tourists.



In an effort to save the economy, the US Congress passed a bill containing a \$2 trillion budget to help those who had lost their jobs and to support domestic businesses. The real question is whether this aid package is enough to fill the expanding hole of job losses. Some questioned the effectiveness of the policy, while others praised the prompt assistance. The result of such a bill is yet to be determined, but such prompt assistance is better than nothing.

Economists warn that it may take years to recover from this recession. What's worse, the tourism industry may never bounce back to what it used to be before the crisis. It is high time that the industry made some changes, replacing what is no longer suitable with a new, healthy, and creative business.
