

Hi! I am Sammy!

I am a Formosan landlocked salmon. I live in the Kyawan River in Northern Taiwan. My ancestors came from the Japanese Sea. They were forced to migrate southward because of a sudden drop in seawater temperatures during the Ice Age 100,000 years ago. The warmer waters around the Taiwan Strait made a new habitat for my ancestors. The formation of mountains blocked their way back to the sea 15,000 years ago. Thus, they were trapped in the inland river and could not go back to the sea. Some call us "living fossils" because we have inhabited this island for more than 1,000 centuries.

To survive, we need un-polluted water that is cooler than 17°C. Unfortunately, the farming and industrial activities of human beings have polluted most of the waters and a majority of my species have been killed. The population of our species was once down to 200 in 1995.

Thanks to the preservation and revival efforts of employees by the Shei-Pa of National Park, there are now more than 5,000 of us swimming safely and happily in the clean cold waters of the Kyawan River.

I am looking forward to meeting you at the beautiful Shei-Pa National Park. By the way, please come to have fun at Sun Yat Sen Memorial Park on December 15th. You will learn more about the story of my family while enjoying delicacies and challenging fun games in the fair.


