There is a strange obsession with blonde hair in our society. Nevertheless, despite being generally regarded as attractive, blonde hair is not associated with intelligence or common sense. In fact, women who are blonde are often referred to as "dumb blondes."

A preference for red and blonde hair can be traced back to the ancient Rome, Greece, and the Mediterranean. However, the association between blonde hair and intelligence wasn't made until medieval Europe. By that time, most of the upper-class had dark hair and was seen as more intelligent. Blonde hair was seen more among the common class, who was considered to be the opposite.

Today, "dumb blonde" jokes drive home the link between blonde hair and stupidity. These jokes show a blonde woman performing odd or dangerous acts because the lack of common sense. More and more movies show that "dumb blondes" are really a myth. When Elle and Buffy are forced to rely on their brains and not their beauty, they became satisfied with themselves. This demonstrates that a focus on appearances often keeps people from discovering good things about themselves, and things which can help them to grow into better people.
